

As I write, we are battling global desertification and climate change in leaderless confusion even though the dangers are greater than in all the wars we've ever fought. Amidst the confusion, argument, strife and despair, there is, however, hope and a rising excitement that winning this battle lies entirely in the hands of ordinary people like you and me.

Society, and thus the institutions through which we act, blames livestock, coal and oil for desertification and climate change. However, livestock, coal and oil are resources needed for centuries to come, and no resource can cause such problems. It is our management of livestock on the land that leads to desertification. Desertification, in turn, renders the land less able to sequester carbon and contributes mightily to climate change.

In the third edition of Holistic Management: A Commonsense Revolution to Restore Our Environment (Island Press, 2016), I've explained how to use the holistic management framework to correct the flaws in the reductionist framework that so commonly guides our management today. Using the holistic management framework we can begin to address the the web of social/cultural, environmental and economic complexity that exists in every management context, but especially in the context of natural resources.

We face the dangers we do believing that someone is in charge, someone who will act sensibly. I wish this was the case but it is not. You are as much in charge as is the President of the United States or the president of any university. We rely on Institutions to lead, but they cannot and will not lead until ordinary people demand change. And this is what we, ordinary people on farms and ranches, in pastoral communities, within universities, environmental and government organizations – are doing by collaborating in the growing global network of locally led and managed Holistic Management hubs, increasing awareness, educating, training, and supporting implementation of Holistic Management in hundreds of different contexts. People are beginning to lead in their private capacities, whether working in or outside institutions, and they are joining with others to collaborate in a broad-based regenerative agriculture movement. The Savory Institute's Land to Market program is attracting serious players in the food and fashion industries who want to ensure this movement thrives. Are we approaching a tipping point? Will we together be able to affect management so we can address the root cause of global desertification and climate change? I finally believe it is possible.

On a more personal note, I am at last able to relax a little at 82, witnessing the intentional holistic design of our network's programs, the incredible depth of knowledge and skill put at the service of humanity through this network, all using the holistic management framework, a truly commonsense approach to restoring our environment.







#### When we design for transformation we embark in a journey of deep learning and commitment.

A commitment to deeply understand the complex system we are seeking to intervene or influence. A commitment to enable its transformation, as much as our own inner transformation. It is not just changing a piece that doesn't work. The whole system shifts, including oneself.

I have been inspired by the work of great systems thinkers and visionaries like Allan Savory and Buckminster Fuller. I have also been incredibly fortunate to be shaped in this important work by many individuals across multiple cultures, contexts and professional backgrounds. All along, I have witnessed that from design, through implementation, to outcomes, transformation starts with people. I mean with people's transformation. From the moment a farmer sees the beauty of the land responding to her nurturing, to the aha moment of a policy maker after "seeing" through the farmer's lense, inner transformation brings about system transformation.

Savory Global is a living and complex system, a human network, a learning platform, an implementation mechanism, a solutions deployment infrastructure, a community of people committed to the transformation of agriculture as a venue to address climate change; poverty; food, nutrition, and water insecurity; but also to bringing about a transformation in humanity, in worldviews, in behavior, in how we live with each other and with our planet, in consciousness. It is a complex, agile, ever-changing and evolving network. However, the core, the intention, that commitment form the incorruptible DNA of Savory.

As Savory Institute, and in our specific function as a node within Savory Global, we are starting with ourselves, our purpose, our passions, our talents, our roles as we serve the communities of practice, as we work and learn with partners, as we co-design and evolve strategies - holistically - to allow for the abundance and the beauty of our holistic context to emerge.






#### Bison Returned From the Brink Just in Time for Climate Change






